The city will host five UEFA EURO 2024 matches in total.

Huge response to nationwide volunteer program

For the first time in the history of the European Football Championship, a joint volunteer program was set up for all ten host cities for the 51 matches of UEFA EURO 2024, with a total of 16,000 volunteers to be deployed. Interest in Germany was huge from day one: More than 30,000 applications were received in the first two weeks alone.
