Stuttgart Arena: State-of-the-art venue for UEFA EURO 2024

Just in time for the European Championships, Germany's sixth-largest sports venue has now been extensively modernized to meet the highest international standards. Five UEFA EURO 2024 matches will be played in the Stuttgart Arena, including at least one match involving the German national team and one quarter-final. On

June 19, 2024 Germany's second group match will take place in the Baden-Württemberg state capital.

The reconstruction of the main stand also included new team cabins, sports function rooms, a high-tech media center including television studios, and a new business area. Some of the renovated areas dated back to 1974 and were therefore much older than other parts of the stadium, which have been gradually modernized in recent years.

New dimension for UEFA EURO 2024: Top infrastructure, unique Tunnel Club experience

During the hosting of UEFA EURO 2024, Stuttgart Arena will have a capacity of 54,272 spectators for international matches without standing room, in line with the UEFA regulations. For VfB Stuttgart's Bundesliga home matches, the stadium has space for 60,058 fans. In the hospitality area, 64 boxes for around 1,000 people are available to guests, while the media center has 148 workstations for television, radio, digital and newspaper reporters. Here there is also a 340-square-meter room for press conferences. Four reporter booths and four television studios, each with 40 square meters of space, have also been set up.

The business area of the stadium has been redesigned and expanded by around 8,000 square meters, with the highlight here being the "Tunnel Club", offering insights into match operations and the teams. From fully glazed rooms, 220 guests can watch the players on their way from the dressing room to the pitch – a unique concept in Germany to date.

Arena modernization with environmental awareness: Concrete recycling and LED technology

The topic of sustainability was also a top priority during the renovations. When gutting and rebuilding the main stand, the project management made sure to recycle building materials and parts of the former interior fittings. Around 90 percent of the concrete used in the old grandstand was recycled and reused, and low-carbon concrete was also incorporated. Energy-saving LED technology has been used in the arena lighting and the new floodlight system, and a computer-controlled and energy-efficient public address system has been in use since summer 2023. In addition, the arena now has its own large-scale catering kitchen for the first time, where preference is given to regionally produced food.
